- The psychological history of Plaintiff; m.
- The damages alleged to have been suffered by Plaintiff; and n.
- Any claims pled by Plaintiff and the Defendants' defenses thereto. o.
- 4. **Electronic media:** The parties have taken reasonable steps to preserve all electronic or computer based media, and will produce the relevant information in a mutually agreed-upon format.
- 5. **Discovery deadline:** The parties propose a deadline of **November 1, 2009**, for completing fact discovery and December 1, 2009 for the completion of expert discovery.
- 6. **Rules accepted:** The parties waive any limitations pertaining to the number of fact witness depositions. The parties agree to the remaining discovery limitations

- imposed by Fed.R.Civ.P. 26(b). The parties reserve, however, the right to seek protection from duplicative and/or harassing discovery requests (including depositions) upon a showing of good cause.
- 7. Other orders: The parties will submit by separate filing an agreed protective order for the Court's consideration.
- 8. **Initial Disclosures accepted:** The parties do not object to the initial disclosures as set forth by Rule 26 (a) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure.
