1 Wellenberger for the Dixie Chicks.  
2 MR. PEEPLES: I'm David Peeples,  
3 City Attorney with West Memphis here  
4 with the witness.  
5 MR. HILAND: Cody Hiland for the  
6 plaintiff, Terry Hobbs.  
7 REGINA MEEK,  
8 having been duly sworn, was examined and testified  
9 as follows:  
10 DIRECT EXAMINATION  
11 BY MS. DAVIS:  
12 **Q Can you introduce yourself to the ladies and**  
13 **gentlemen of the jury?**  
14 A I'm Regina Meek, lieutenant at the West Memphis  
15 police department.  
16 **Q Lieutenant, my name is D'Leslie Davis and I'm an**  
17 **attorney that represents Natalie Pasdar in a case brought**  
18 **by Terry Hobbs. Do you understand that?**  
19 A Yes.  
20 **Q Have you ever had your deposition taken before?**  
21 A On an accident case only.  
22 **Q So even if you've done it once you know that the**  
23 **testimony you're giving here today is just the same as if**  
24 **you were sitting in a courtroom talking to a judge or a**  
25 **jury?**

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1 A Yes.  
2 **Q And we've got a Court Reporter here taking us**  
3 **both down and it's difficult for her to take us both down**  
4 **at once, so can we agree that you will try to let me**  
5 **finish my question before you begin answering and if you**  
6 **will agree to that I'll try to let you finish your answer**  
7 **before I start asking another question. How does that**  
8 **sound?**  
9 A Yes, that's fine.  
10 **Q If you need to take a break for any reason, will**  
11 **you let me know?**  
12 A Yes.  
13 **Q And if for any reason you don't understand one**  
14 **of my questions, will you let me know that, too, and I'll**  
15 **be happy to try to rephrase it or restate it?**  
16 A Yes.  
17 **Q Have you reviewed anything before coming here to**  
18 **give your deposition today?**  
19 A The subpoena.  
20 **Q Fantastic. Anything other than the subpoena?**  
21 A Since I've been here I've read this letter from  
22 Lieutenant Mitchell.  
23 **Q Great. There are two documents in front of you**  
24 **that we're going to talk about in just a minute that I**  
25 **gave to you this morning for you to review before your**

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1 **deposition, is that correct?**  
2 A Yes.  
3 **Q And other than those two documents which will**  
4 **end up being deposition Exhibit No. 1 and deposition**  
5 **Exhibit No. 2, have you reviewed any other documents**  
6 **before giving your deposition?**  
7 A No.  
8 (Whereupon, the above-mentioned  
9 documents were marked as Exhibit Nos. 1 and 2  
10 to the testimony of the witness.)  
11 **Q Have you had any conversations with anybody**  
12 **about any potential deposition testimony you might give**  
13 **today, other than your lawyer?**  
14 A No.  
15 **Q Fair enough. Can you tell me just a little bit**  
16 **about your educational background and your work history**  
17 **background? I'll just let you walk through that for the**  
18 **jury, if you will.**  
19 A High school graduate. I've had some college. I  
20 was hired at the police department in January of 1985, and  
21 I've been with the West Memphis Police Department since  
22 that time.  
23 **Q What are the various positions that you've held**  
24 **at the West Memphis Police Department?**  
25 A Patrolman, detective, sergeant, lieutenant.

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1 **Q And when did you become a detective?**  
2 A 1996, I think.  
3 **Q So from 1985 through sometime in 1996 you were a**  
4 **patrolman, is that right?**  
5 A Yes.  
6 **Q And what's the title as patrolman?**  
7 A It's patrolman.  
8 **Q Fantastic. And what were your job duties and**  
9 **responsibilities as a patrolman from 1985 to 1996?**  
10 A I patrol, provide security, answer calls, take  
11 reports, see citizens, normal law enforcement duties in  
12 patrol.  
13 **Q Where are you from originally?**  
14 A Missouri.  
15 **Q And when did you get to West Memphis?**  
16 A In 1984.  
17 **Q And how did you get down to West Memphis?**  
18 A My father.  
19 **Q I gather then that you were a patrolman on May 5**  
20 **of 1993?**  
21 A Yes.  
22 **Q And May 5th of 1993 is the date of the murder of**  
23 **three little boys in West Memphis, Tennessee, is that**  
24 **correct?**  
25 A Yes.

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1 MR. WELLENBERGER: Arkansas.  
2 **Q I'm sorry, Arkansas. I'm in Memphis, Tennessee,**  
3 **but I'm talking about murders in West Memphis, Arkansas,**  
4 **correct?**  
5 A Yes.  
6 **Q Are you familiar with those murders being**  
7 **referred to as the Robinhood Hills murders?**  
8 A Yes.  
9 **Q And ultimately there were three teenagers that**  
10 **were convicted of those murders, is that correct?**  
11 A Yes.  
12 **Q And are you familiar with them being called the**  
13 **West Memphis three?**  
14 A Yes.  
15 **Q If I refer to just "the murders," you will**  
16 **understand that I'm talking about the Robinhood Hills**  
17 **murders?**  
18 A Yes.  
19 **Q What specifically were your job duties and**  
20 **responsibilities on May 5th of 1993, as best you can**  
21 **recall?**  
22 A I was patrolling and assigned to the northeast  
23 sector of town.  
24 **Q What is the northeast sector of town?**  
25 A 7th and Broadway northeast.

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1 **Q What shift were you working on May 5th of 1993?**  
2 A 3:00 to 11:00 shift, evening shift.  
3 **Q Did you have an officer or supervisor that you**  
4 **reported to on May 5, 1993?**  
5 A Yes.  
6 **Q Who was that, if you can remember?**  
7 A I don't know what his rank was at the time, but  
8 I believe it was Joplin.  
9 **Q J-O-P-L-I-N?**  
10 A Yes.  
11 **Q On May 5, 1993, during your shift, can you**  
12 **explain to the jury how you would come to be at a**  
13 **particular area in your territory at any given time?**  
14 A Other than regular patrol I was dispatched to  
15 calls, various calls. I couldn't recall what kind of  
16 calls that night, but I was dispatched to various calls by  
17 the dispatcher.  
18 **Q And how does that work when you are dispatched**  
19 **to various calls? Can you give me the chain of events?**  
20 **Somebody calls in with a problem and it goes to dispatch**  
21 **and dispatch tells you where to go?**  
22 A Right. Dispatch answers the phone, takes the  
23 information for the call, gives the address, and then will  
24 dispatch the proper officer, whoever is working that ward,  
25 to respond to the call.

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1 **Q Let me back up and just do a quick house**  
2 **cleaning measure. Let me have you look at the document**  
3 **that I've marked as Deposition Exhibit No. 1 and my**  
4 **question to you is, is that a true and correct copy of a**  
5 **deposition notice and a subpoena that was served on you**  
6 **for you to appear here today to give your deposition?**  
7 A Yes, except for the proof of service, yes.  
8 **Q What do you mean except for the proof of**  
9 **service? Yours is not filled out and the one you're**  
10 **looking at is?**  
11 A Right.  
12 **Q Fair enough. The subpoena that you have a copy**  
13 **of doesn't have the proof of service filled out by the**  
14 **officer?**  
15 A Right, exactly.  
16 **Q And my exhibit, which came to me after the**  
17 **officer served you, does have the proof of service filled**  
18 **out?**  
19 A Correct.  
20 **Q When do you first recall being involved in any**  
21 **way in a search for three little boys on May 5, 1993?**  
22 A I was dispatched. I cannot recall the address.  
23 It was on the corner of 14th and Barton in reference to a  
24 missing juvenile.  
25 **Q Do you know just approximately -- I know it's**

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1 **been 16 years, but can you recall approximately what time**  
2 **you were dispatched?**  
3 A Around 8:00 p.m.  
4 **Q And prior to this approximate time of 8:00 p.m.,**  
5 **meaning from 3:00 when you went on your shift to**  
6 **approximately 8:00 p.m. when you were dispatched to 14th**  
7 **and Barton, did you have any involvement whatsoever in a**  
8 **search for three missing little eight-year-old boys?**  
9 A No.  
10 **Q Were you aware during that time period that**  
11 **three eight-year-old little boys were missing?**  
12 A Not to my knowledge.  
13 **Q Do you recall whose residence you were**  
14 **dispatched to at approximately 8:00 p.m.?**  
15 A Mark and Melissa Byers' residence.  
16 **Q Do you recall what you were told by the dispatch**  
17 **that you received?**  
18 A They gave me the address and asked me to respond  
19 in reference to a missing juvenile.  
20 **Q A missing juvenile. Anything else you can**  
21 **recall about the dispatch call that you got?**  
22 A No, ma'am.  
23 **Q What occurred when you arrived at Mark and**  
24 **Melissa Byers' home?**  
25 A I was accepted in the home and they proceeded to

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1 tell me that their son was missing and I started gathering  
2 information for a report.  
3 **Q What types of information do you gather when**  
4 **you're taking a report like that?**  
5 A Height, weight, hair color, eye color, last  
6 known clothing that they were wearing, last place they  
7 were seen, what time they were last seen.  
8 **Q Did you take that type of information from Mark**  
9 **and Melissa Byers on May 5, 1993?**  
10 A Yes.  
11 **Q Can you recall any other conversation that you**  
12 **had with Mark or Melissa Byers when you went to their home**  
13 **on May 5, 1993?**  
14 A I'm not sure what you're trying to ask me.  
15 **Q What else do you recall about being over at**  
16 **their home at approximately 8:00 p.m.? You met with them,**  
17 **they let you in the house. You took down the types of**  
18 **information that you would need.**  
19 A There was a knock on the door. I'm not sure  
20 which one answered it, but there was a lady outside that  
21 asked to speak with me when I finished there.  
22 **Q Do you know who the lady was?**  
23 A It was Ms. Moore.  
24 **Q Is that Dana Moore?**  
25 A Yes, I didn't know that at the time, but that's

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1 who it was.  
2 **Q When you were speaking with Mark and Melissa**  
3 **Byers, did you understand that their son was named**  
4 **Christopher?**  
5 A Yes.  
6 **Q And did you have any understanding as to whether**  
7 **Christopher was alone or with other people?**  
8 A At the time I talked to them they said as far as  
9 they knew he was by himself.  
10 **Q So they didn't mention Stevie Branch or Michael**  
11 **Moore?**  
12 A No.  
13 **Q Anything else that you can recall transpiring**  
14 **while you were at the home of Mark and Melissa Byers prior**  
15 **to the time that Dana Moore knocked on their door?**  
16 A I asked them to check their home again to make  
17 sure he wasn't hiding in a closet or somewhere in the  
18 home.  
19 **Q Anything else?**  
20 A Not that I can recall.  
21 **Q So when you finished with them, what did you do?**  
22 A I went outside and spoke to Ms. Moore outside.  
23 **Q Do you recall anyone besides Ms. Moore being**  
24 **outside the Byers' home?**  
25 A No, ma'am.

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1 **Q Did you talk to anyone else outside the Byers'**  
2 **home other than Dana Moore, that you can recall?**  
3 A At that time, no.  
4 **Q Do you recall seeing anybody in the**  
5 **neighborhood?**  
6 A Her daughter.  
7 **Q Anyone else?**  
8 A No.  
9 **Q And tell me what you can recall about your**  
10 **conversation with Ms. Moore, which would now be**  
11 **sometime -- and this is just approximate -- but sometime**  
12 **after 8:00 p.m.**  
13 A She told me that earlier in the evening her son,  
14 Michael Moore, and a boy named Steve Branch and  
15 Christopher Byers were playing outside and she observed  
16 them ride off on two bicycles toward Robinhood Hills, and  
17 she tried to call her son back and he didn't respond and  
18 she sent her daughter after him, but she couldn't catch up  
19 with them, and they've been looking for them ever since.  
20 **Q Do you recall if she told you a time that she**  
21 **had seen the boys ride off toward Robinhood Hills?**  
22 A I'm sure she told me the time, but I have not  
23 reviewed the reports so I could not give that to you.  
24 **Q And that raises a good point. What sort of**  
25 **documentation is created by you when you have a**

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1 **conversation like you did or take a report like you did**  
2 **from the Byers or from Ms. Moore?**  
3 A Any information they give me should be in the  
4 narrative of the report, including the description of the  
5 person.  
6 **Q And is the narrative report the title of a**  
7 **particular form document or is it simply some notes that**  
8 **you take?**  
9 A It's the offense report, the incident report.  
10 Every incident report has a narrative and the information  
11 that I obtain from speaking to the person would be on that  
12 incident report.  
13 **Q And on May 5, 1993, did you complete an incident**  
14 **report related to your dispatch call to the Byers' home?**  
15 A Yes, I did.  
16 **Q And would you have -- instead of "would you**  
17 **have," did you create a different incident report related**  
18 **to what you learned from Ms. Moore?**  
19 A Yes, I did.  
20 **Q Other than what you've just described about your**  
21 **conversation with Ms. Moore, can you recall anything else**  
22 **that she told you?**  
23 A No.  
24 **Q Fair enough. What did you do next after taking**  
25 **-- is it fair to say taking this incident report from**

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1 **Ms. Moore?**  
2 A After she advised me that there were three  
3 children involved and I was already there on two reports,  
4 I called for another officer.  
5 **Q And how did you do that?**  
6 A On the radio. I called for the officer to --  
7 **Q You called dispatch -- excuse me for**  
8 **interrupting. I'm sorry. I said I wouldn't do that.**  
9 A I called and asked for another officer to take  
10 an additional report. And it would play out like this or  
11 normally it would play out like this. Either an officer  
12 would volunteer to come and said they were directed to the  
13 call or dispatch would make sure someone was sent,  
14 depending on how busy we are.  
15 **Q When you make the call, who do you call**  
16 **requesting another officer?**  
17 A Dispatch.  
18 **Q Do you recall how it came down that another**  
19 **officer became involved with the search for the three**  
20 **missing kids after you made the call requesting another**  
21 **officer?**  
22 A The officer came to where I was at and I had  
23 Ms. Moore give directions to the third house, that would  
24 be the Steve Branch house, and asked the officer that  
25 responded to go over there and make contact and possibly

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1 take a report if that child was missing.  
2 **Q You stayed with Ms. Moore at the Byers' home**  
3 **after you called dispatch requesting an additional**  
4 **officer?**  
5 A Yes, ma'am, but I called for an additional  
6 officer as soon as she told me there were three children  
7 involved. I hadn't taken the information for the report  
8 yet when that happened.  
9 **Q Fair enough. So you were actually not just**  
10 **staying there with Ms. Moore, you were actually taking the**  
11 **information for the report while you were expecting the**  
12 **additional officer to become involved?**  
13 A Correct.  
14 **Q And the additional officer, do you recall the**  
15 **name of the additional officer?**  
16 A John Moore.  
17 **Q John Moore then actually came to the Byers' home**  
18 **and met you and Ms. Moore --**  
19 A Correct.  
20 **Q -- when he became involved?**  
21 A Yes.  
22 **Q And then you had a conversation with Mr. Moore,**  
23 **I assume, when he got there -- oh, sorry, Patrolman Moore?**  
24 A Officer Moore.  
25 **Q You had a conversation with Officer Moore then**

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1 **when he got to the Byers' home where you and Ms. Moore**  
2 **were talking?**  
3 A Correct.  
4 **Q And is there any relationship between Officer**  
5 **Moore and Dana Moore?**  
6 A No, ma'am.  
7 **Q What do you recall about your conversation with**  
8 **Officer Moore while you were there with Ms. Moore?**  
9 A I explained to him that I was down here on one  
10 juvenile missing and I discovered there were three  
11 juveniles missing. I was taking a report on two of them.  
12 I asked him to go to the third residence and make contact  
13 with the parents and see if that child was missing and  
14 if that child was missing if he could take a report.  
15 **Q When you say third residence, are you talking**  
16 **about the home of Terry Hobbs?**  
17 A I guess so, yes, ma'am.  
18 **Q It's the home where Stevie Branch lived?**  
19 A Yes, where Steve Branch lived.  
20 **Q Anything else you can recall about your**  
21 **conversation with Officer Moore at that time?**  
22 A Not at that time.  
23 **Q What is your understanding of what Officer Moore**  
24 **did after you and Ms. Moore gave him the address of the**  
25 **residence where Stevie Branch lived?**

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1 A I was finishing the report for Ms. Moore when  
2 Officer Moore came back and said that the mother was at  
3 work and that the stepfather was at home and that he  
4 didn't know where his child was either.  
5 So I asked Officer Moore if he would mind going to  
6 the mother's place of employment, which was I believe  
7 Catfish Island, and take a report for the third child. And  
8 I had already broadcast the information and descriptions of  
9 the two children, but we needed further information for the  
10 third child.  
11 **Q Would you expect Officer Moore to have**  
12 **documented an incident report or otherwise his**  
13 **conversation with Stevie Branch's stepfather at Stevie**  
14 **Branch's home?**  
15 A Not normally.  
16 **Q Because?**  
17 A Normally we're there on the initial call and  
18 unless it becomes an issue later we would take the  
19 information from the reporter, which would have been the  
20 mother. She was the one filing the report. So the  
21 information she gave would be in that report.  
22 **Q And, again, I know that your times are**  
23 **approximate, but would this be sometime likely between**  
24 **8:00 and 9:00 p.m., maybe 8:30 and 9:00 p.m.?**  
25 A Yes, ma'am. The offense reports -- if you had a

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1 copy of the offense reports it reflects the exact times we  
2 take the reports so that the three different reports would  
3 have three different times on them.  
4 **Q And bear with me. I'm trying to follow on the**  
5 **procedure that you're describing for me, but since there**  
6 **wouldn't be any documentation of the time that Officer**  
7 **Moore was at the Stevie Branch home because an incident**  
8 **report wasn't taken, there would be no documentation that**  
9 **would reflect that time?**  
10 A Not unless he was asked later to document it.  
11 **Q So then based just on your recollection of the**  
12 **times that all of this was going on, and again knowing**  
13 **that these are approximate times because it's been a long**  
14 **time, is it likely that we're talking between 8:30 and**  
15 **9:00 p.m. that Officer Moore would have been at Stevie**  
16 **Branch's home, does that sound about right?**  
17 A Probably around 8:30, yes.  
18 **Q What is your understanding of what Officer Moore**  
19 **did after you discussed with him that the mother was at**  
20 **work at Catfish Island?**  
21 A He came back to the scene where I was at and he  
22 explained he took the report from her and she was  
23 extremely upset because she wasn't even aware that her son  
24 wasn't at home. My understanding was that he went with  
25 other searchers to Robinhood Hills.

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1 **Q Was Terry Hobbs with Officer Moore at the time**  
2 **that Officer Moore came back to you to report that he had**  
3 **spoken to the stepfather of Stevie Branch?**  
4 A No.  
5 **Q What did you do after you finished taking the**  
6 **information for the incident report from Ms. Moore?**  
7 A I was of the understanding that other searchers  
8 had went into Robinhood Hills from the 14th Street end, so  
9 I went to the other end of Robinhood Hills, McAuley  
10 Street, and was going to cross over there to look for them  
11 as well.  
12 **Q Approximately what time is this?**  
13 A I couldn't give you an approximate time. I know  
14 it had just turned dark.  
15 **Q Had you done any searching elsewhere before you**  
16 **arrived at the 7th Street end of Robinhood Hills, and by**  
17 **searching I mean for the three boys?**  
18 A I had talked to people who were outside  
19 explaining to them we had three children missing. As I  
20 went on my way there, I stopped at every person that I  
21 saw.  
22 **Q Was there a reason that you were going to**  
23 **Robinhood Hills first as opposed to searching elsewhere?**  
24 A Because Ms. Moore had said that they frequent  
25 Robinhood Hills and that was the last direction they were

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1 going at the time that they saw them.  
2 **Q Let me direct your attention to deposition**  
3 **Exhibit No. 2 and I'll represent to you that this is a**  
4 **document that was in the police file relating to the**  
5 **Robinhood Hills murders that I had a copy made of. Have**  
6 **you ever seen this document before?**  
7 A Right before the deposition.  
8 **Q Other than right before the deposition, have you**  
9 **ever seen this document before?**  
10 A No, ma'am.  
11 **Q It's dated November 1st of 2007 and it purports**  
12 **to be a letter from lieutenant Ken Mitchell of the City of**  
13 **West Memphis to Brent Davis, the prosecuting attorney. Do**  
14 **you know who Brent Davis was?**  
15 A Yes, ma'am.  
16 **Q And was he involved in this Robinhood Hills**  
17 **murder case?**  
18 A Yes, ma'am.  
19 **Q And do you know how he was involved?**  
20 A Prosecutor.  
21 **Q You had a moment to read through the contents of**  
22 **this letter, correct?**  
23 A Yes.  
24 **Q Does Deposition Exhibit 2 accurately set forth**  
25 **how you searched on the night of May 5 of 1993 following**

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1 **taking the information from Mr. Byers and Ms. Moore**  
2 **sufficient to create an incident report?**  
3 A Oh, yes, ma'am.  
4 **Q And specifically let me read just a couple of**  
5 **portions of it. Beginning with the second sentence,**  
6 **"Lieutenant Meek stated she did not personally enter the**  
7 **Robinhood Hills area, but believed that Officer Johnny**  
8 **Moore, now Sergeant Johnny Moore, and approximately six to**  
9 **eight individuals, both male and female, went into**  
10 **Robinhood Hills to search for the boys." Is that an**  
11 **accurate statement regarding what you did on the night of**  
12 **May 5, 1993?**  
13 A Yes, ma'am.  
14 **Q Continuing on, "Lieutenant Meek stated due to**  
15 **the large number of mosquitoes she did not believe the**  
16 **boys would stay in an area congested with mosquitoes. She**  
17 **checked the area for vacant houses and**  
18 **outbuildings/sheds." Is that also accurate?**  
19 A Yes.  
20 **Q It's fair to say then that you did not search in**  
21 **Robinhood Hills for the three missing boys on the night of**  
22 **May 5 of 1993?**  
23 A No, ma'am, I did not enter Robinhood Hills.  
24 **Q So my statement was fair, you did not search in**  
25 **Robinhood Hills?**

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1 A Correct.  
2 **Q There's a pipe bridge down at the Seventh Street**  
3 **end entrance to Robinhood Hills, is that correct?**  
4 A McAuley Street, yes, ma'am.  
5 **Q McAuley Street, sorry. Did you cross that pipe**  
6 **bridge at any time?**  
7 A No, ma'am.  
8 **Q And I believe I've seen in your trial testimony**  
9 **at some of the trials of the West Memphis three in this**  
10 **case that the bulk of the search that you performed was in**  
11 **your patrol car, is that right?**  
12 A Yes, ma'am.  
13 **Q And describe for me what sort of search for the**  
14 **boys you did in your patrol car.**  
15 A I would stop at every shed or empty house, get  
16 out, go inside and check them, speak to the people in the  
17 neighborhoods and as time went on I expanded my search  
18 from just that immediate area to larger.  
19 **Q Do you remember seeing Terry Hobbs at all on the**  
20 **night of May 5 of 1993?**  
21 A I don't recall.  
22 **Q Did you ever speak to Terry Hobbs on the night**  
23 **of May 5 of 1993?**  
24 A I don't recall speaking to him.  
25 **Q And if Terry Hobbs told the West Memphis police**

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1 **that he searched in Robinhood Hills with you for the boys,**  
2 **would that be a true or false statement?**  
3 A False.  
4 **Q Is three or four minutes an approximate time**  
5 **that you were at the pipe bridge or is there some other --**  
6 **I'm trying to just quantify the time that you were at the**  
7 **pipe bridge area near McAuley Street and Robinhood Hills.**  
8 A I don't recall how long I was down there. I  
9 seem to recall a couple of teenagers that met me over  
10 there. I may have spoke to them, but I can't recall how  
11 long I was there.  
12 **Q Fair enough. What else did you do or what did**  
13 **you do following the time that you went to the Robinhood**  
14 **Hills area?**  
15 A I continued to search. I continued to make  
16 contact with people. I went to the convenient stores,  
17 talked to the clerks, just expanded my search from there.  
18 **Q And at some point you got a different dispatch**  
19 **call, is that right?**  
20 A Yes, ma'am.  
21 **Q Do you recall when that was?**  
22 A No, ma'am.  
23 **Q Describe for me what you recall about that**  
24 **dispatch call.**  
25 A It was more than one I was called away from the

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1 search on and I could not tell you what they were for  
2 exactly. I do not recall. If you can give me a specific  
3 one I might be able to remember.  
4 **Q Fair enough. I realize that I'm talking about**  
5 **sixteen years ago. Do you recall how many dispatch calls**  
6 **you got on the night of May 5, 1993, after you had taken**  
7 **the information for the incident reports from Dana Moore**  
8 **and the Byers?**  
9 A Not without looking at the log sheet, no, ma'am.  
10 **Q Do you recall if it was more than one?**  
11 A Yes, ma'am.  
12 **Q So it was at least two?**  
13 A At least two.  
14 **Q Do you recall at all the reasons for the calls?**  
15 A No. I know one because we had to testify in  
16 Court.  
17 **Q Let's talk about that one then. Is that the**  
18 **only one you remember, is that fair to say?**  
19 A I remember being called away to other calls, but  
20 I could not tell you the content of those calls.  
21 **Q Let's talk about the one you remember there. Do**  
22 **you remember what the call was about?**  
23 A It was about a male bleeding in the bathroom.  
24 **Q Where?**  
25 A At a restaurant called Bojangles.

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1 **Q And do you recall what you did in response to**  
2 **that call?**  
3 A Yes, ma'am. I left my district and went to the  
4 northwest district to take a call and when I got there the  
5 manager met me outside and said the man had left. So in  
6 that area we do have a lot of -- at the time we had a lot  
7 of transients that would stay across the tracks, so I  
8 asked which way he went and he told me and I attempted to  
9 locate the individual.  
10 So I went around the two buildings and found the  
11 easiest access to the tracks and went over the tracks and  
12 searched that area as best I could for someone who might  
13 need help and searched the immediate area -- after I  
14 couldn't find anything there, I searched the immediate area  
15 for someone that might be bleeding and I saw no blood trail  
16 or anything like that and then I returned to look for the  
17 little boys.  
18 **Q Had the report stated that the man was bleeding?**  
19 A Yes, they said he was bleeding.  
20 **Q Did you do any search inside the restaurant or**  
21 **any investigation inside the restaurant?**  
22 A No, ma'am.  
23 **Q Why not?**  
24 A He had already left. I was more concerned with  
25 finding him.

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1 **Q After performing the search you just described**  
2 **regarding this individual from the Bojangles restaurant**  
3 **call, what did you do next?**  
4 A I went back to the store and talked to the  
5 manager and told him I couldn't locate the individual, if  
6 he should happen to return give us a call back.  
7 **Q Did you do any investigation or search of the**  
8 **restaurant at that point?**  
9 A No.  
10 **Q Why not?**  
11 A The manager had told me the man had left.  
12 **Q Any other reason?**  
13 A I'm there on that particular call looking for  
14 the individual. The manager said he was gone. The  
15 manager is the one that called us.  
16 **Q What did you do after you left the Bojangles**  
17 **restaurant then the second time?**  
18 A I returned to my district looking for the boys.  
19 **Q And can you describe what you did regarding the**  
20 **search of the little boys at that point?**  
21 A I continued the search where I had left off. I  
22 can't remember what part I was at, but I continued that  
23 search because I was making a larger spectrum search.  
24 **Q When you say larger search, we're not talking**  
25 **about the woods anymore?**

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1 A No, neighborhoods and stores and people that are  
2 out and such as that.  
3 **Q As best you can recall then following the**  
4 **Bojangles Restaurant call, did you get called away again**  
5 **from searching for the boys?**  
6 A I can't recall.  
7 **Q How long did you search for the boys?**  
8 A Until well after my shift was over.  
9 **Q And your shift was to be over at 11:00?**  
10 A Uh-huh.  
11 **Q I'm sorry, I need you to say "yes" or "no."**  
12 **It's hard for the Court Reporter to take down "uh-huh."**  
13 A Yes. A few minutes after my shift was over.  
14 **Q Were there other officers searching for the boys**  
15 **when you left a few minutes after your shift was over?**  
16 A No, ma'am.  
17 **Q And did you have any understanding as to whether**  
18 **officers were going to begin to search for the boys after**  
19 **your shift was over?**  
20 A I was going to report to the night shift  
21 commander and see if they could get another officer out  
22 there to assist with families searching.  
23 **Q Were families still searching when your shift**  
24 **was over?**  
25 A When I left there was a group of people on 14th

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1 Street between two houses and there were family members  
2 there. I could not tell you now, because it's been too  
3 long ago, what family members it was, but it appeared in  
4 my mind I remember it was family friends and searchers  
5 standing there. I explained to them I had to leave and  
6 that I would find the night shift manager and try to get  
7 another officer over there.  
8 **Q Did you contact the night shift manager?**  
9 A The commander, yes.  
10 **Q The commander, I apologize. What did you tell**  
11 **him?**  
12 A I told him that the three boys were still  
13 missing and asked if he could send an officer over to  
14 assist them.  
15 **Q What did the night shift commander tell you?**  
16 A I don't recall.  
17 **Q Do you recall whether he said he would get an**  
18 **officer out there to help search for the boys?**  
19 A I don't recall what he said. I remember they  
20 were busy at the time, but I couldn't recall what he said.  
21 **Q Just to make sure that I understand, do you**  
22 **recall him saying, "No, we don't have any men available to**  
23 **go out and help search"?**  
24 A I don't recall what he said.  
25 **Q You don't recall one way or the other. When you**

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1 **left the police station for the night, do you recall what**  
2 **time that was?**  
3 A Not exactly, probably about 11:45.  
4 **Q Did you have any understanding at that point as**  
5 **to whether other West Memphis police officers or personnel**  
6 **would be assisting with the search for the boys through**  
7 **the night?**  
8 A I was hoping they would, yes, ma'am.  
9 **Q You didn't know one way or the other, but you**  
10 **were certainly hoping that they would?**  
11 A Yes.  
12 **Q Did you expect that they would be?**  
13 A Yes, ma'am.  
14 **Q And to the best of your recollection, as you sit**  
15 **here today, at no time during May 5th of 1993 did you have**  
16 **a conversation with Terry Hobbs?**  
17 A I don't recall. I don't recall specifically  
18 speaking to him. I can't recall.  
19 **Q The idea is anything is possible since it's been**  
20 **16 years, but as you sit here today you do not have a**  
21 **recollection of talking to him on May 5th of 1993, is that**  
22 **a fair statement?**  
23 A Yes, ma'am.  
24 **Q And as you sit here today you do not have a**  
25 **recollection of seeing Mr. Hobbs on May 5, 1993, is that**

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1 fair?  
2 A He may have been in the group of parents that  
3 were there and I spoke to all of them as a group, but I  
4 don't recall speaking to him individually.  
5 **Q Describe for me what you recall about speaking**  
6 **to any of the families as a group. When you say something**  
7 **like that to a lawyer they've got to follow up. I**  
8 **apologize.**  
9 A I explained to the family I had to leave and I  
10 was going to request that another officer show up. If an  
11 officer didn't show up they were to call the police  
12 department and request one or call the chief or call the  
13 Mayor or call whoever they had to.  
14 **Q Did you tell them that?**  
15 A Yes, ma'am.  
16 **Q Can you remember anything else about that**  
17 **conversation that you had with the families collectively?**  
18 A Not really, just they thanked me for sticking  
19 with them and helping them out.  
20 **Q Do you remember any of the family members that**  
21 **were there for that conversation? I understand you don't**  
22 **remember that Terry Hobbs was there specifically. Do you**  
23 **remember, for instance, if Mark Byers was there or Dana**  
24 **Moore?**  
25 A I think Ms. Moore for sure was there. I'm

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1 thinking Ms. Byers was there, but I don't really recall.  
2 I just remember in my mind that it was a group of parents,  
3 family and searchers that were there. To say individually  
4 one person, I'm really not going to --  
5 **Q I appreciate that and I don't want you to guess.**  
6 **Other than the conversation with Mr. Byers when you took**  
7 **information for that incident report and the conversation**  
8 **with Ms. Moore when you took information for that report**  
9 **and the conversation with the collective families as you**  
10 **were going to the police station to ask for additional**  
11 **police assistance in the search, do you recall any other**  
12 **conversations with family members who were looking for the**  
13 **little boys on May 5, 1993?**  
14 A I may have had conversations with them several  
15 times that night because I did make contact as they came  
16 in and out of the woods, but I couldn't recall who they  
17 were, what was said, or any of that.  
18 **Q Can you recall anything else about your**  
19 **involvement in the search for the little boys or taking**  
20 **information for incident reports on May 5, 1993, other**  
21 **than what you've described?**  
22 A No, ma'am.  
23 **Q Did you have any involvement in the search for**  
24 **the little boys on May 6th of 1993?**  
25 A No, ma'am.

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1 **Q Did you report for duty at any time prior to**  
2 **3:00 p.m. on May 6 of 1993?**  
3 A No, ma'am.  
4 **Q In other words, you worked your regular shift on**  
5 **May 6, 1993?**  
6 A Yes.  
7 **Q Did you receive any phone calls at any time from**  
8 **11:00 p.m. on the night of May 5 to 3:00 p.m. on the**  
9 **afternoon of May 6th requesting additional assistance in**  
10 **the search for the three little boys?**  
11 A No, ma'am.  
12 **Q If you had gotten a call at 3:00 in the morning**  
13 **on the morning of May 6th that said, "Patrolman Meek, we**  
14 **don't have enough people to head out and search for these**  
15 **boys through the night. Can you come back on duty and**  
16 **assist with the search," what would your response have**  
17 **been?**  
18 A I'll be there as soon as I drop my son off at  
19 the babysitter.  
20 **Q No question about that?**  
21 A Right.  
22 **Q Is that something that could have happened**  
23 **according to West Memphis Police Department protocol?**  
24 **Could they have called you back to help search?**  
25 A Oh, yes, ma'am.

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1 **Q Whose call would that have been?**  
2 A At the time I couldn't -- now it's usually going  
3 to be the shift commander.  
4 **Q That was my assumption, that it would have been**  
5 **the night shift commander.**  
6 A Right.  
7 **Q But it could have been a number of people?**  
8 A It could have been a dispatcher. It could have  
9 been a detective. It could have been any number of people  
10 at the time that if when they felt that additional  
11 personnel was needed they would call us in.  
12 **Q Did you have any involvement in the**  
13 **investigation of the murders after the little boys' bodies**  
14 **were found on May 6th of 1993?**  
15 A No, ma'am.  
16 **Q Back on May 5, 1993, as part of your job duties**  
17 **and responsibilities, were you ever involved in murder**  
18 **investigations?**  
19 A No, ma'am.  
20 **Q Who handles that within the West Memphis --**  
21 **well, I did it again. I'm talking about the present tense**  
22 **and I need to go back to 1993, I apologize. Back on May**  
23 **5, 1993, who would have been responsible for handling**  
24 **murder investigations?**  
25 A The criminal investigation division.

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1 Q Do you recall what individual headed up the  
2 criminal investigation division in May of '93?  
3 A I believe it was Gary Gitchell.  
4 Q Are there detectives in that division that would  
5 have been involved in the homicide investigation?  
6 A Yes, ma'am.  
7 Q Other than hearing down at the police station in  
8 formal discussions of what was going on in the murder  
9 investigation, did you have any role whatsoever in  
10 investigating or hearing about the search for the killer  
11 of the three little boys?  
12 A No, ma'am.  
13 Q Can you describe what West Memphis was like as a  
14 community and a place to live prior to the Robinhood Hills  
15 murders?  
16 A That neighborhood or the city as a whole?  
17 What's your question?  
18 Q Let me be candid with you. I had heard West  
19 Memphis was a real nice place to live and raise a family  
20 back in 1993. Do you agree with that?  
21 A Yes, I live there with my son.  
22 Q I'm wanting to contrast the community feeling  
23 prior to the murders with some of the concern and fear  
24 that was in the community following, understandably, the  
25 murder of three little boys.

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1 A Well, prior to this happening children rode  
2 their bikes without being constantly being watched by  
3 parents. They were allowed to walk to the convenient  
4 store. Any residential neighborhood you go into would  
5 always have lots of children out, always. After the  
6 murders you saw no children out by themselves.  
7 Q Let me ask you this question as a parent. Had  
8 you had any concerns or heard anything about satanism in  
9 West Memphis prior to May 5 of 1993?  
10 A As a parent, no.  
11 Q And following the murders, tell me a little bit  
12 about how the community came together to support the  
13 victims' families and to bond together to try to find the  
14 killers.  
15 A I believe they had a reward offer. I know that  
16 they had donated a reading nook at the school the children  
17 went to and built a reading nook for the children that  
18 went there, which was really, really nice. There's  
19 several different things they did to help support the  
20 families.  
21 Q I had heard that the school district provided  
22 counseling services to the kids. Are you familiar with  
23 that?  
24 A In that school.  
25 Q In that particular school?

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1 A Yes, ma'am.  
2 Q And then I had also heard that a number of  
3 churches offered services for people that needed  
4 counseling?  
5 A Yes, ma'am.  
6 Q Were you proud of how the city came together?  
7 A It surprised me, but, yes, ma'am.  
8 Q What was the community's feeling about wanting  
9 to catch whoever was responsible for these murders?  
10 A Everyone, everyone that I talked to, wanted them  
11 caught and wanted them caught quickly to see who would do  
12 this type of crime.  
13 MS. DAVIS: Why don't we take a  
14 break for just a minute and let me  
15 look through some notes and come back  
16 briefly.  
17 THE VIDEOGRAPHER: We're going  
18 off the record. The time is  
19 approximately 9:48 a.m.  
20 (Brief Recess)  
21 THE VIDEOGRAPHER: We are now  
22 back on the record. The time is  
23 approximately 9:55 a.m.  
24 Q Lieutenant Meek, can you describe for the jury  
25 the kind of media attention that this case has gotten?

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1 A Nation wide, even from other countries, from  
2 what I understand. Over these years it has just been  
3 amazing how many people have come to look at the case file  
4 or were looking for certain documents or needing  
5 information, personal searches.  
6 Q Have you seen it on news reports and in the  
7 newspapers?  
8 A Yes.  
9 Q All over the place?  
10 A All over the place.  
11 Q Since the time of the murders to the present?  
12 A Yes.  
13 Q And has there been a contingent of the press  
14 coverage and the public that think that the West Memphis  
15 three were wrongfully convicted?  
16 A You have part of them that believe they were  
17 wrongfully convicted and you have about as many that  
18 believe they were properly convicted, so it's two-sided.  
19 Q Absolutely. Is it fair to say that there's been  
20 a lot of public debate about that?  
21 A Yes.  
22 Q And have the West Memphis three, to your  
23 knowledge, taken steps to try to get a new trial?  
24 MR. PEEPLES: I'm going to have  
25 to step in here. I'm not sure she's

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
