Nelson White stated that he was not sure this was his brother, Clark White, further stating he went to get his other brother Larry White and returned to the victims residence, with Nelson's Girlfriend, Anita Cope, and at this time they identified the victim as their brother, Clark White. The (2), Nelson and Larry White stated that they checked the residence, before notifying the Sheriff Department, with Nelson checking the North bedroom and Larry checking the bedroom to the South end of the home. Both stated they did not touch or move anything except light switches and door knobs to bedrooms.

Immediately after the undersigned officers arrived on the scene, we determined the victim was dead and exited the home and secured the scene, notifying Crittenden County Sheriff's investigators and Coroner.

At 11:46 p.m., 1-15-93, Chief R.D. Clay, Crittenden County Sheriff's Department Investigator arrived on the scene at which time the scene was turned over to Chief Clay. At 0026 a.m., 1-16-93, Coroner Kent Hale arrived on scene.

CRIME SCENE

This Crime Scene is located at Route 1, Box 493, Crawfordsville. It is a house trailer. The victim was lying on the couch on his back with a white wash cloth on his forehead.

It was apparent that the victim had been dead for several days. The thermostat was turned up to 90 which is as far as it goes. Inside temperature of the house was 90% plus. The victim's body had already started decomposing. He was swollen to the point his blue jeans were tearing as was the rest of his clothing. The victim's body fluids had ran onto the floor and couch and soaked into his clothes. It appeared to this Investigator that the victim had aspirated on himself.

There was chairs at each end of the couch (north and south end). There was a coffee table in front of the couch. On the coffee table there were three (3) drinking cups. The one in front of the victim and the one to the north were empty. The cup to the south had a clear liquid and it was recovered by this Investigator. There was a blue telephone on the coffee table also. All of these cups and the telephone were seized as evidence to try to obtain latent prints off of.

The TV was on in the living room. The northern bedrooms, the beds were made and were not ransacked. In the north bedroom a rifle and a crossbow were leaning up against the wall.

In the kitchen it appeared someone had done some cooking. On the kitchen island in a clear plastic bowl wrapped in a paper towel was some Sleepaway (manufactured by Fort Dodge) poison. This along with several other items on the counter top were seized for latent prints. Also the counter top was processed as well as other parts of the house for latent prints.

In the south bedroom on the bed was clothes from the laundry and items that appeared to be laid out so the victim could have taken them to his assignment in Jonesboro. On the TV in this bedroom was the victim's police I.D, his badge and checkbook. During the Crime Scene Search none of the victim's handguns were found.

Mr. WRIGHT was advised of his rights as per the CID 116 Form and his responses were recorded thereon. A copy of the Rights Form has been forwarded to the Little Rock Office to become a permanent part of this file.

Mr. WRIGHT stated that CLARK WHITE had signed him up to be a Confidential Informant for the Crittenden County Drug Task Force approximately three weeks ago, and that Mr. WRIGHT has not seen him since. Mr. WRIGHT did state that a couple of Friday nights ago he was contacted by one of CLARK WHITE's friends OLIVER WILSON who works at the Crittenden County Sheriff's Department as a jailer.

Mr. WRIGHT stated that he was advised by OLIVER WILSON, to go to ALEX FURLOW and buy some Crack/Cocaine, and he was given \$40.00 by OLIVER WILSON to do so. Mr. WRIGHT stated that he contacted ALEX FURLOW and bought \$40.00 worth of Crack/Cocaine and brought the dope back to OLIVER WILSON and was then paid \$10.00 for his trouble by OLIVER WILSON.

Mr. WRIGHT since this time he has had no further contact with OLIVER WILSON or CLARK WHITE.

Mr. WILSON stated that CLARK WHITE had contacted him by phone and asked him to contact ARCHIE WRIGHT and furnish ARCHIE WRIGHT with \$40.00 for the purpose of buying Crack/Cocaine from FURLOW, and to give \$10.00 to ARCHIE WRIGHT for his trouble and that CLARK stated he would pay him back when his check came in.

Mr. WILSON stated that he did what was requested by CLARK WHITE and that CLARK WHITE came by his house later that evening and picked up the dope that WRIGHT had purchased from ALEX FURLOW.

Mr. WILSON stated that he did not see anything unusual about the type of transaction and that he knew that CLARK would pay him back.

Mr. WILSON stated the only other friend of CLARK WHITE that he knew of that CLARK associated with was RODNEY RILEY, who worked for the West Memphis Police Department. WILSON stated that he has been to Memphis on several occasions with CLARK WHITE, they went to a night club called Sharrods.

WHITE stated that CLARK and CHARLES NUNN were very good friends and that the calls made prior to Thanksgiving probably concerned the Thanksgiving holidays and hunting trips that were going to be taken by CHARLES NUNN and CLARK.

On Friday, 1-15-93, the date that CLARK'S body was found LARRY WHITE stated that his brother NELSON WHITE and his girlfriend had come in there earlier in the day on Thursday, and spent the night with him and had planned to spend Friday night at CLARK'S trailer and visit with CLARK.

At approximately 11:00 p.m. MR.
