We got there and immediately started eating chicken. CLARK already had the chicken at his house. I drank water in the pink cup. CLARK had one-half (1/2) of beer in the black cup and ALBERT had one-half (1/2) of the beer in the white cup.

While the chicken was in the microwave I saw CLARK cut open a jug of some kind. I saw CLARK throw the jug into the trash. I did not see anyone but CLARK pour the contents of the jug into the cup. I did not know what was in the jug.

We were in the living room then and CLARK was on the phone to security. I don't know where. Then he choked for a moment and keeled over. ALBERT said. "Help me put him on the couch." I did then I went and got a towel and put some ice and put it in ALBERT'S hand and ALBERT placed the towel with the ice in it over his head.

We stayed a couple of minutes. I thought CLARK was asleep. I wanted to go and get his Mama and ALBERT said, "No, he will be alright." ALBERT took the keys from the table and we left and went to ALBERT'S house who also lives on Able Street.

I've read this statement and it's true and correct to the best of my knowledge. I've been advised of my Constitutional Rights and freely gave this statement without an attorney present. Signed ERIC LEWIS and witnessed by E. A. FITZPATRICK, ASP, and DWIGHT LEE, ASP. Statement signed at 7:05 p.m.

HUGGINS stated that on the way over, he did not drive the car to Earle, Arkansas that CLARK WHITE drove the car and following CLARK WHITE's death at the trailer, he got the keys to the car, from MARK ERIC LEWIS and then they left the trailer and returned to Memphis, Tennessee, at which time he did drive the car.

HUGGINS stated that he had no part in the death of CLARK WHITE and would be willing to submit to a polygraph examination to support this fact.

You have the right to remain silent, you do not have to make a statement. Anything you say can, and will be used against you in a court of law. You have the right to be represented by a lawyer, either of your own choice, or court appointed, if you cannot afford one. You have the right to talk to your lawyer before answering any questions and to have your lawyer with you during questioning, if you wish.

- Q. Do you understand each of these rights as I have explaiend them to you?
- A. Yes
- Q. Having these rights in mind, do you wish to make a statement?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Albert Huggins, will you tell me what your activities were, starting in the morning, of 01-10-'93.
- A. Troy informed me that he was going to go and get some more money to continue the party. Me, Troy and Renee went to a Super Save Grocery Store in Earl, AR. Troy cashed a check, I think it was for three hundred something dollars, cause he knew the manager there and he spoke to him. I think the manager was a black fella. Then, we left Earl, AR and came straight back to Memphis.

Then, ah, alright we, came back and he bought some more rocks to smoke. I think that lasted for a while. Then, ah, he ah, one of the little fella let him have some on credit. I think he owed him about \$200.00, that's the reason we went back to Arkansas so he could get the money that he owed the fella. On the way back there, we stopped back to Earl we stopped in West Memphis to get gas and then we went on back to his house. On Monday 01-11-'93, me and Troy went back to Earl, AR to get the money that he owed the fella for the rocks that he had got on credit.

We got to Troy's trailer at maybe between 1:00 and 2:00 p.m. We went in the trailer, Renee, myself and Troy. Then, he started straightening up his trailor. We asked him did he have something to eat. He had some fried chicken that he had bought from some chicken place and we warmed that up. He had some smoke sausages and I put some cheese on the smoke sausages and I opened up a can of fruit cocktail and macaroni and cheese and I put that on the eyes. Troy called his mother and talked to her. When she hung up he called somebody else, cause he still trying to get the money to bring back over here. While we was eating he acted like he was getting sick. Me and Renee asked him if he was alright and he said "yes," but I know he had consumed a lot of smoke, a lot of rocks. He had got sick, like he was having a seizure. I went to the box and got some ice cubes out and wrapped them up in a face towel and wet them and put it across his face. He looked like he was coming back around. So, I said "Troy, how we gonna get home" and he said he wanted to get some rest and I told him we could go on to Memphis and he could come and get his car later. He was breathing and had the ice cubes on his head and there was nothing wrong with him when we left there, he was alive.

Troy gave me his car keys me and Renee drove back to Memphis. Renee called his mother and she asked Renee if we got home safe. She said she had went over there and checked on him and he was asleep. Then, Renee called back to his mother's at about 6:00 that afternoon and she said he was still sleep. The next thing I find out is that his name isn't Troy and he's a DEA Agent or something and he had passed you understand. Renee talked to his mother everyday. Renee would call his mother from her mother's house.

- A. One (1) can of beer was split between me and Troy and I drunk a glass of water.
- Q. What cup did you have?
- A. I had a can.
- Q. Did you see a bottle of Sleep Away in the kitchen?

- Q. Did Renee have any?
- A. Naw.

The above described subject was interviewed by this Investigator and Crittenden County Sheriff's Department Investigator ED LAXTON on April 29, 1993 at approximately 2:30 p.m. at the Crittenden County Court house in Marion, Arkansas.

The suspects rights described as per the CID 116 form were read and explained to him and his responses were recorded thereon. A copy of the rights form has been forwarded to the Little Rock office and will become a permanent part of this file.

MR. HUGGINS stated that in fact, on Monday, January 11, 1993, himself, MARK ERIC LEWIS, and CLARK WHITE were at CLARK WHITE's trailer in Earle, Arkansas. HUGGINS stated that he did not know how the sleep away got into CLARK WHITE's drink, but he did not put it in there and had no knowledge of anyone else putting it in his drink.

HUGGINS stated that it was factual that on January 10, 1993, CLARK WHITE did incur a four hundred (\$400.00) dollar debt from BOOKER T. SHELTON in Memphis, Tennessee. HUGGINS stated that CLARK WHITE was advanced forty rocks of Crack Cocaine for a total price of four hundred (\$400.00) dollars on the previous day, and he was expected to pay five hundred and twenty five (\$525.00) dollars in repayment of the debt on January 11, 1993. HUGGINS stated that CLARK WHITE did in fact, put the car in pawn with BOOKER T. SHELTON, and on the following day, he and LEWIS did ride to Earle with CLARK WHITE so he could get some money and return to Memphis and pay BOOKER SHELTON off.



On Friday, January 28, 1994, a jury deliberated for approximately two hours and came out with a verdict of guilty on Mr. HUGGINS for capital felony murder and gave him life in the penitentiary without parole. He was also found guilty on theft of property and given a fifteen thousand dollar fine and twenty years in prison. This was in reference to the death of Officer CLARK WHITE.

The co-defendant, Mr. LEWIS, plea bargained earlier in the month for a five year sentence for second degree murder, and twenty years on the theft of Officer WHITE's car.

Both subjects were turned over to the Arkansas Department of Corrections.

CRIMINAL - SUPREME COURT SPLITS ON SUFFICIENCY OF EVIDENCE TO SUPPORT CAPITAL MURDER CONVICTION AND DISSENTING JUSTICES HOLD THAT DEFENDANT WAS MISCHARGED AS TO THEFT

Huggins v. State - #CR94-564. Appeal from Circuit Court of Crittenden County, Hon. Samuel Turner Jr. AFFIRMED.

Held: Conviction of capital murder and sentence of life imprisonment without parole, and conviction of theft of an automobile and sentence of 20 years, were affirmed. Opinion by Justice Brown. Justices Dudley, Newbern, and Roaf dissented in an opinion written by Justice Newbern.

Brief Facts: The victim worked for the Crittenden County Sheriff's Department Drug Task Force and knew the defendant and the a co-defendant. The victim had a personal relationship with the two defendants and smoked crack cocaine with them and bought drugs on credit, putting up a Pontiae Firebird for collateral which was actually owned by the sheriff's department. The defendant lived in Memphis and after buying drugs on credit the two defendants drove the Pontiae and the victim to Arkansas so the victim could get some money to pay for the drugs he'd purchased on credit. While in the victim's trailer and while preparing food, the defendant put Sleep Away (a drug used in the cuthanasia of animals) nto the victim's drink. The victim soon began foaming at the nouth and keeled over in pain. The other defendant wanted to go or help but the defendant of this case stopped him. The two men lrove the Pontiae Firebird back to Memphis and the victim was ound dead about four days later.

Justices Newbern, Dudley, and Roaf dissented, disagreeing

that the evidence was sufficient to support a conviction of capital murder, that the evidence was entirely circumstantial and did not exclude every other reasonable hypothesis of guilt. These justices also held that the defendant should have been charged with theft by receiving and that the Supreme Court should not affirm a conviction of an offense which did not occur. "Theft" as defined in A.C.A. §5-36-103(a) did not occur. "Theft by receiving" (A.C.A. §5-36-106) would have been more appropriate.

Important Points: 1. There was sufficient evidence, albeit circumstantial, to support the conviction of capital murder. The defendant stopped the other defendant from getting help, left the victim there to die, returned to Memphis and did not notify the victim's family (which lived in the same trailer park) or the authorities about his condition, picked up the bottle of Sleep Away with a paper towel so as not to get his fingerprints on it, and never returned to the victim's trailer to check on him.

2. When the two defendants took the Pontiae to Memphis after leaving the victim in his trailer, they both knew that the car was owned by the sheriff's department. They delivered the car to the Memphis drug dealer as collateral for the victim's outstanding debts. There was substantial evidence of theft of property.

leld: State's appeal from conviction of defendant was dismissed.

Ipinion by Justice Newbern.

rief Facts: This is a state appeal from the conviction of the efendant, Chad Jones, of first degree murder and second degree attery that was reported in 6 ACB 16, CR95-397. The crimes ere committed in a Harvest Foods parking lot in Sherwood and irround a publicized case involving the death of Jason Hatcher at a shootout with a number of other young men. The jury invicted defendant Jones and the state brought this appeal asking at the Supreme Court declare trial court error by refusing to armit certain evidence tending to show that defendant Jones was

a member of a street gang known as the Southwest Kings. However, it should be noted that the trial court did allow other references to the "Southwest Kings."

Important Point: The Supreme Court dismissed this state appeal because the trial court made no sweeping decision about the admissibility or inadmissibility of evidence of gang membership of a criminal defendant. There was no technical interpretation of an evidence rule. The trial court used its discretion to exclude evidence it apparently thought might result in unfair prejudice.

RIMINAL -- TRIAL ON REMAND BRINGS CONVICTION OF SECOND DEGREE MURDER AFFIRMED ON APPEAL

iggs v. State - #CR95-478, Appeal from Circuit Court of Crittenin County, Hon. David Burnett. AFFIRMED.

eld: Conviction of second degree murder and sentence of 20 ars imprisonment were affirmed. Opinion by Justice Glaze.

ief Facts: There were no details regarding the crimes in this se. This defendant was tried and convicted of first degree murder I due to trial error, the case was remanded. On remand, the fendant was convicted of second degree murder. He appealed in that conviction. The victim was a woman who had apparently jected his overtures for dates so he harassed her and eventually

murdered her.

Important Points: I. The defendant was tried the second time using a bifurcated trial procedure which had been put into place between his first and second trials. He complained on appeal that the trial court's decision to retroactively apply the new law in his case violated the Ex Post Facto Clause. The Supreme Court disagreed, holding that the bifurcated sentencing laws did not criminalize conduct that was previously non-criminal, did not increase the severity or harshness of the punishment for the offense that the defendant committed, and did not deprive the defendant of a defense that was available to him at the time he

I met clark white through a mutual friend, used to come to my house to party, we were smoking crack cocaine, mark lewis, it was a gay situation, but they kept that smothered during the trial

he got to my house on a thurs, January, around 6th or 7th, we consumed a lot of alcohol, drinking, the issue about the car, the car was already in pawn when he came to my house; i had permission to drive it; he was buying dope, in area where i lived; he liked to be around,. He felt safe there;

car was already in pawn to one of the dope dealers there; we were partying; fixing something to eat at his house, mac and cheese, boiled eggs, smoked sausage, i got a can of fruit cocktail; he had one of these big quart cans of beer; i poured a little bit of beer in his cup, mark's cup, in a can

he got on telephone, trying to call his mother; i saw them at counter, thought they were cutting dope, they were at a sink, i didn't see what he had took out of the c abinet; him and mark cut it and i didn't pay no attention, he went back in and set down on his couch; about five or ten minutes after he sat down, he started having convulsions, i htought he was having a grand mal seizure; mark said, no, he poured some of that stuff in his cup; i asked mark to help me lay him on the couch; i loosened his clothes, put some ice around his neck, trying to bring him around, he was gagging, bucking, we panicked; i told mark, this is not going to look good for us to be here with this man

go back to memphis, you call his mother; i thought mark had called his mother but he had not; i said tell him what he did; i was led to believe he's all right; but everything didn't unfold until we found out that he had passed; mark called me; i said i thought you said he was all right

we turned ourselves in; i said we didn't do anything to him; but come to find out later

he had full blown aids and mark had full blown aids, and they had made a suicide pact, unbeknownst to me; i wrote mark two letters, since he's been out, told him I'd forgiven him for lying on me

i had asked the investigating officers

laxton, fitzpatrick; said I'd take a lie detector test to prove my innocence; i called fbi myself; i was trying to tell them what was going on; mark's statement, i wasn't even near them when they were arrested
