

INVESTIGATIVE REPORT TRIPLE HOMICIDE BYERS/MOORE/BRANCH

ON 052793, I CONDUCTED AN INTERVIEW WITH VICTORIA HUTCHESON AT THE MARION POLICE DEPARTMENT. PRESENT DURING THAT INTERVIEW WAS INSPECTOR G. GITCHELL AND DETECTIVE SGT. M. ALLEN. VICKI IS A WHITE FEMALE WITH A BIRTH DATE OF 042963 WHO LIVES AT RT 2 BOX 103 IN HIGHLAND TRAILER PARK. WE WERE INFORMED EARLIER IN THE DAY THAT CHIEF DON BRAY OF THE MARION POLICE DEPARTMENT HAD SOME INFORMATION THAT HE HAD RECEIVED FROM VICKI THAT MAY BE OF VALUE IN THE ABOVE ONGOING INVESTIGATION.

VICKI INFORMED ME THAT SHE HAD GOTTEN CLOSE TO DAMIEN ECHOLS IN THE LAST FEW WEEKS AND THAT HE HAD TAKEN HER TO A "ESPOT" IN A SECUDED LOCATION NEAR TURRELL, ARKANSAS. VICKI STATED THAT SHE WAS INTRODUCED TO DANIEN BY A "LITTLE JESSIE" MISKELLY A COUPLE OF WEEKS AGO AND THAT SHE HAD BECOME VERY CLOSE TO DAMIEN SINCE THAT TIME. SHE STATED THAT WHEN SHE WENT TO TURRELL ON 05-19-93. A WEDNESDAY, THAT SHE OBSERVED AN ORGY IN THE DISTANCE THROUGH THE WOODS AND SHE IMMEDIATELY ASKED DAMIEN TO TAKE HER AWAY FROM THAT PLACE WHICH HE DID. SHE STATED THAT SHE COULD NOT MAKE OUT WHO WAS PARTICIPATING IN THE ORGY DUE TO THE FACT PARTICIPANTS HAD PAINT ON THIER FACES AND THAT THEY WERE SOME DISTANCE AWAY FROM WHERE SHE WAS. SHE STATED THAT SHE COULD SEE THAT THERE WERE GIRLS AND BOYS TAKING PART IN THE DRGY. SHE STATED THAT DAMIEN DID NOT TAKE PART IN THE DRGY AND REFERRED TO HIM AS NOT HAVING TO TAKE PLACE IN ANY OF THAT ACTIVITY RATHER THAT HE COULD DO ANY THING IN THE ACTIVITIES HE WANTED TO. VICKIE STATED THAT SHE ROAD UP TO TURRELL WITH DAMIEN IN A RED FORD ESCORT THAT HE WAS DRIVING.

DAMIEN STATED THAT HE HAD BEEN QUESTIONED BY INSPECTOR GITCHELL ABOUT THE MURDERS AND THAT HE WAS EVEN ACCUSED OF THE MURDERS BUT THAT HE DID NOT CONFESS. VICKIE STATES THAT HE HAS NEVER DENIED THAT HE KILLED THE BOYS NOR HAS HE ADMITTED TO KILLING THE BOYS TO HER. SHE STATES THAT DAMIEN HAS FIVE GIRL FRIENDS AND THAT HE HAS ONE THAT IS PREGNANT AND HE HAS BEEN SPENDING MORE TIME WITH HER LATELY DAMIEN IS SUPPOSED TO BE A MEMBER OF A GROUP OF BOYS KNOWN AS THE DRAGONS AND THAT THEY WORSHIP DRAGONS IN THIER MEETINGS. ALSO SHE STATED THAT PART OF THIER RITUAL WAS THAT THEY WERE SACRFICING GENITALS.

SOME OF THE MEMBERS IN THE GROUP ARE ROBERT BURCH, SHAWN WEBB, JASON BALDWIN, LITTLE JESSIE MISKELLY, "SNAKE", AND

SHE STATED THAT SHE HAD HEARD THAT ROBERT BURCH HAD TOLD A GIRL NAMED WHITNEY THAT HE HAD KILLED THE BOYS AND THAT SHE HAD BETTER NOT TELL ANYBODY OR SHE WOULD BE KILLED. SHE APPARENTLY TOLD A GIRL NAMED JENIFER ABOUT WHAT ROBERT HAD TOLD HER. JESSIE HAD ALSO TOLD HER ON AN OCCASION THAT HE HAD SEEN ONE OF THE BOYS BEHIND THE BLUE BEACON WEARING A PINK SHIRT JUST BEFORE HE HAD BEEN KILLED.

VICKI STATED THAT SHE HAD HEARD THAT DAMIEN WAS THE PERSON RESPONSIBLE FOR THE MURDERS AND THAT SHE KNEW THAT JESSIE WAS A FRIEND OF HIS. SHE STATED THAT SHE TOLD JESSIE THAT SHE THOUGHT THAT DAMIEN WAS HOT AND SHE WANTED TO MEET HIM. SHE STATED THAT HER ONLY REASON FOR MEETING DAMIEN WAS IN AN EFFORT TO GET INFORMATION ABOUT THE MURDERS AND THAT SHE EVEN HAD PURCHASED SOME BOOKS ABOUT SATANIC WORSHIPPING IN AN EFFORT TO LEARN MORE ABOUT THE GROUP AND WHAT THEY DO. SHE FURTHER STATED THAT SHE LEFT THE BOOKS OUT WHERE DAMIEN COULD SEE THEM IN ORDER TO GET THE CONVERSATION GOING ABOUT WITCHCRAFT WITH HIM. SHE STATED THAT HE NOW TRUSTS HER AND THAT HE WILL TAKE HER ANYWHERE WITH HIM.

VICKI STATES THAT DAMIEN AND THE GROUP THAT HE RUNS WITH WILL ALWAYS DISAPPEAR ON WEDNESDAY AT ABOUT 6:00PM AND SHE IS SURE THAT THEY ARE TAKING PART IN ORGY ACTIVITIES AND DEVIL WORSHIPPING AT THAT TIME JUST AS THE ONE SHE WITNESSED ON THE 19TH.

ON WEDSNESDAY THE 5TH ON MAY VICKI WAS PICKING UP HER SON AT THE SCHOOL WHERE HE WAS CLASSMATES WITH MICHAEL AND CHRIS. SHE STATED THAT HER SON WAS AARON HUTCHESON AND THAT HE WAS ALSO BY YEARS OLD AND BEST FRIENDS WITH THOSE TWO. SHE STATED THAT AARON ASKED HER TO LET HIM GO WITH MICHAEL AND CHRIS TO DO SOME "CUBSCOUT" STUFF. HOWEVER SHE KNEW THAT IT WAS NOT A NIGHT THAT THE CUBSCOUTS WERE TO BE MEETING AND SHE THOUGHT THAT THE BOYS WERE ONLY WANTING TO GO AND PLAY. SHE STATED THAT AARON WAS IN THE CUDSCOUT TROUP WITH THE OTHER BOYS AND THAT THEY WERE VERY CLOSE

ON THURSDAY SHE TOOK AARON TO SCHOOL AND FOUND THAT THE BOYS WERE MISSING. SHE STATED THAT AARON WANTED TO GO TO THE CLUB HOUSE AND THAT HE WAS SURE THAT WAS WHERE THE BOYS HAD GONE. SHE STATED THAT WHEN SHE PULLED DOWN ON W. MCAULEY THAT THE POLICE HAD ALL PULLED DNTO THAT STREET AND THAT SHE DID NOT GO TO THE CLUB. SHE STATED THAT SHE KNEW WHERE THE CLUB HOUSE WAS AND THAT SHE HAD SEEN IT BEFORE WHEN SHE HAD GONE TO THE ROBIN HOOD WOODS TO LOBK FOR AARON. SHE STATED THAT SHE HAD TALKED TO A KEVIN JOHNSON WHO TOLD HER THAT THERE WAS NO CLUB HOUSE IN THE WOODS AND THAT HE HAD SEARCHED FOR THE BOYS AND NOT SEEN THE CLUBHOUSE. SHE STATED THAT SHE KNEW THAT THERE HAD BEEN A CLUBHOUSE AND THAT SHE WOULD SHOW US A LITTLE LATER WHERE THE CLUBHOUSE WAS.

VICKI STATED THAT AT THE FURNERAL OF ONE OF THE BOYS A NEWSPAPER REPORTER HAD APPROACHED AARON AND ASKED HIM ABOUT THE BOY WHO WAS BEING BURIED. AT THIS TIME SHE STATED THAT SHE SHOULD BE GETTING AARON AWAY FROM THE OTHER KIDS AND NEWS REPORTERS. SHE SENT AARON TO FORT SMITH FOR A COUPLE OF WEEKS TO HEPL HIM GET OVER THE LOSS OF HIS FRIENDS.

WHILE AARON WAS GONE SHE BECAME INTIMATE WITH DAMIEN STATEING THAT HE AND HIS FRIENDS WOULD ALWAYS GO TO THE SKATING RINK ON FRIDAY NIGHTS AND THAT SHE WAS AWARE OF THEM SMOKING MARIJUANNA DN SEVERAL OCCASIONS. SHE FURTHER STATED THAT THEY WERE OBTAINING THIER DOPE FROM A PAM CARTER WHO LIVES IN HIGHLAND TRAILER PARK. SHE FURTHER STATED THAT DAMIEN HAS BECOME VERY JEALOUS OF HER AND THAT A COUPLE OF NIGHTS AGO SHE HAD A MALE FRIEND OVER AND THAT SHE DISCOVERED THAT A STRONG BORAD THAT SUPPORTS SOME FLOWERS ON HER FRONT PORCH HAD BEEN BROKEN DURING THE NIGHT. SHE ALSO STATED THAT DAMIEN HAD BEEN CALLING HER AND ASKING HER WHO SHE WAS NOW SEEING. SHE STATED THAT SHE HAD HEARD OF ANOTHER PLACE WHERE SOME DEVIL WORSHIPPING HAD TAKEN PLACE WAS AT VANNDALE, ARKANSAS AT A PLACE KNOWN AS PARADISE COVE.

HAD BEEN ON THE GROUND ON THE SIDE OF THE DITCH AND HAD WATCHED THE MEN ON THE GROUND UNDER THE HOLLOWED OUT TREE. AARON SHOWED US HOW HE HAD CLIMBED UP A VINE TO GET INTO THE TREE HOUSE. IT APPEARED THAT AARON COULD HAVE SEEN ALL OF THE ACTS THAT HE REPORTED FROM THAT TREE HOUSE. HE ALSO DESRIBED WHERE THE MEN HAD KILLED A CAT AND CUT HIS HEAD OFF AS BEING ABOUT 15 FEET EAST OF THE TREE HOUSE.



A transcript of the tape-recorded statement she gave is attached to this memorandum.
