On or about June 17, 1993, I filed a Motion for Discovery in the above-referred-to case. In this Motion for Discovery, I requested pursuant to Rule 18.3 of the Arkansas Rules of Criminal Procedure that the defendants be required to inform the State of the nature of any defense which their counsel intends to use at trial and the names and addresses of persons whom defense counsel intends to call as witnesses in support of said defense. I also requested that the State be informed of and permitted to inspect and copy or photograph any reports or statements of experts made in connection with this case, including the results of physical or mental examinations and of scientific tests, experiments or comparisons. I am writing this letter simply to remind you of your obligations under the rules of discovery.

I assume that some time in the near future, you will provide us with the discovery required by the Arkansas Rules of Criminal
